A WORD TO OUR FRIENDS ABOUT COMMUNION:

Welcome! As members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, we're excited to share what Holy Communion means to us. We believe that when we receive the bread and wine, the body and blood of Jesus Christ are truly present "in, with, and under" them—not because the bread and wine change into something else or merely symbolize His body and blood, but because Jesus Himself said, "Take, eat, this is My body" and "Take, drink, this is My blood." Through His divine Word, we trust that we're truly receiving Christ's body and blood along with the bread and wine.

For us, this Sacrament is more than a memorial—it's Jesus coming to us in a real, tangible way. We believe it is Christ truly coming to us and offering His body and his blood in an outward sign of His love for us and as an outward assurance of the forgiveness He won for us by His death on the cross. This is what we believe and confess about Holy Communion, rooted in Scripture and our faith in Christ.

If you're not a member of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and have questions about our Communion practices—or if you'd like to join us at the Lord's Table—we'd love for you to talk with our pastor beforehand. After reading this and reflecting on your own beliefs, please fill out the Pew Card in the pew rack. When the offering plate comes by, place your tithes and gifts in it, then pass your Pew Card to the center aisle for the ushers to collect. May God bless our time together in this Communion service!

- Gluten-free communion wafers are available by taking one from the paten (plate) that is sitting separately in a white container.
- *Grape Juice* (clear liquid) is available in the center of the tray containing individual cups of regular wine (red liquid).

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P Risen Lord Jesus, we sing about the victory over sin that You have won for us through Your death and resurrection; but we often don't live it very well. We still cave in to sin's attractiveness every day. Sometimes we even indulge in it. Worst of all, we remain reluctant to confess our sins and so receive the forgiveness and cleansing that You have promised.
- C Lord, too often I deny my sins. When I cannot deny them, I try to justify them—to You and to those I've wronged—with excuses or attempts to make up for them. Lord Jesus, enable me to realize that my sins are undeniable. They are inexcusable. They are unrepayable. But they are all forgivable. That's what Your resurrection is all about! Enable me to come clean before You—and to believe that by Your sacrifice I am forgiven.

- P God is gracious and freely forgives all who come to Him in repentance and faith. I announce this precious forgiveness to each of you in the name of the Father and of the risen T Son and of the Holy Spirit.





- P Our risen Savior, before we ask anything of You, we lay before Your feet all our worship, adoration, praise, and thanksgiving.

- P We remember before Your throne those whose joys are being stolen by the circumstances of life. We remember those sick and in need of Your care, [especially . . . Linda Kelly, the family of Amber Kowalski (friend of Dorothy Christman), Tom Druin (friend of Bill & Dorothy Christman), Bruce Kirkland. Chris Sabin, John Vogel, Ken & Mary Werring].
- We lift up our brothers and sisters in Christ before Your throne, trusting in our great heavenly physician to use doctors, nurses, medicines, and miracles, according to Your will, to bring healing and health to them. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P For those who struggle every day, Lord Jesus, show compassion on them;
- C Look with compassion on those struggling paycheck to paycheck; for the homeless, the ones living in poverty; and so many we have not named but are known to You, almighty God. Care for them as only You can. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P We pray for those who govern, both in our land and in others.
- C We pray for world leaders and all in authority, that they would be guided by Your Spirit. Lord, hear our prayer.

- P We pray for those who are imprisoned, and we remember those imprisoned for nothing more than their faith in Jesus.
- As You showed grace to the thief on the cross, show Your grace to those imprisoned who do not know You. We ask protection for the ones persecuted for their faith. Lord, hear our prayer.
- P Into Your hands, O Lord, we commend all our requests.
- We pray these and all the prayers of our heart in the name of Jesus, risen on the third day, who with the Father and the Holy Spirit are one God, now and forever. Amen.



THE WORDS OF OUR LORD

If all Jesus had to do was die, then why is Easter such a big deal?

Easter is a very important day. Easter is the day that we celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the dead.
